Is there whole school singing, how regularly and what form does it take?	The children sing weekly in class and whole school assemblies
Is there classroom singing time on a regular basis?	Yes, through formal music lessons. Children rehearse for events such as the Nativity play and community events such as the Christmas Fair, Church Services, Gala Day, visits to the Residential Nursing Homes, Village Hall
Are there whole class instrumental programmes incorporating singing?	Yes. All children from Year 2 upwards learn to play the recorder and this incorporates singing skills. Year 3 & 4 learn to play the Ukulele and Year 5 & 6 learn to play a Brass instrument. All lessons incorporate some singing
Is there a before school choir, a lunchtime choir or an after school choir?	Yes – Recorder Club will run in Spring Term, KS2 Choir run in the Spring Term, Ukulele Club, Spring term, KS1 Singing Club run in the Summer Term after school.
Is there a boys choir?	No Not this year, but boys participate and are very much encouraged to sing and to attend all music related Clubs
